## Plant together

Main Plant	Good Companions	Why They Help
Tomatoes	Basil, Marigold, Onions,	Basil boosts flavor, marigolds deter
	Carrots	pests.
Carrots	Onions, Lettuce, Peas,	Onions deter carrot flies, tomatoes
	Tomatoes	provide shade.
Lettuce	Carrots, Radishes, Cucumbers,	Shade and soil moisture improvement.

## **Avoid Planting Together**

Plant Combination	Reason to Avoid
Tomatoes + Potatoes	Both attract blight.
Beans + Onions/Garlic	Onions stunt bean growth.
Carrots + Dill	Dill may deform carrots.
Cucumbers + Potatoes	Increased disease risk (blight).
Cabbage + Strawberries	Compete for space and attract pests.

## **Helpful Companion Flowers**

Flower	Benefit
Marigold	Repels nematodes, aphids, and whiteflies.
Nasturtium	Lures aphids away, repels beetles.
Borage	Attracts bees, deters tomato hornworms.
Calendula	Pollinator magnet, deters aphids.
